Week of June 14th, 2020 - Discussion Questions for Ohana Groups Devoted: Fellowship | Acts 2:42-47

Overview

In Acts 2:42-47, we see a summary of the early church's activity. The church devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, fellowship, breaking of bread, and prayer. This week, we focus on what it means to devote ourselves to **fellowship**.

ICEBREAKER

What is your favorite thing to do to spend time with family/friends?

BIBLE: Read Acts 2:42-47

- 1. What descriptions of fellowship did the early church participate in Acts 2:44-47? Which descriptions surprise or intrigue you?
- 2. What aspect of fellowship in the early church do you most desire for yourself? For your family? For your Ohana Group or church?
- 3. "Being together" (verse 44), is fundamental to fellowship. Why is it so important for believers to "be together?"
- 4. The believers had everything in common by giving voluntarily in order to accomplish what?
- 5. What is the importance of fellowship in light of our current situation? Share recent testimonies of fellowship.

APPLICATION

Fellowship is founded upon our common union with Jesus Christ and expressed in life together in worship, love for one another, and practical commitment to one another. Being in fellowship with one another is **sharing in a common devotional life** (worship, reading Scripture, prayer), **living life together** (support, encouragement), **living in harmony** (unified in commitment and mission), and **sharing with those in need** (hospitality, benevolence). Which areas of fellowship does your Ohana Group excel at? Which areas do you need to work on? Discuss ways to build up your weaknesses and hone your strengths.

PRAYER

- 1. In Psalm 42, the psalmist initially yearns for God, but then he expresses the desire to return to the "house of God…with shouts of joy and praise among the festive throng." Pray for a heart that seeks to worship God in fellowship with one another (Psalm 42:4).
- 2. Pray that fellowship does not simply become an "event" or "function," but deep and meaningful "koinonia" which gives glory to God.
