BIBLE: READ 1 THESS. 4:16-5:2 & REV. 20:11-15

QUESTIONS TO DISCUSS

1. What are some descriptions of what it will look like when the Lord Jesus returns at His second coming? (1 Thess. 4:16-18)
2. What does it mean that Jesus will come like a “thief in the night” Why is this so? (1 Thess. 5:1-11)
3. At the great white throne of judgement, will your name be in the book of life? How do you know? (Rev. 20:11-13)

3b. What does it mean for those whose names are not in the book of life? What should we therefore do? (Rev. 20:14-15)

APPLICATION

1. Continue to memorize the five finger Gospel points A.) Jesus came from heaven to teach us the Kingdom of God. B.) The Cross – Christ Removes Our Sin and Shame. C.) He rose again, giving victory over Satan, sin, and death. D.) He ascended to Heaven where He now rules and prays for us. JESUS is LORD! E.) He’s coming back to judge the world and bring eternal justice.

3. Do you believe that He will judge the world and bring eternal justice? What does that mean to you?
