DEVOTIONAL


Use this Pentecost devotional solo, with your family,
or in any small group to invite the Spirit's presence together.

Scripture Reading: Acts 2:1-4


"When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them."


Summary: Pentecost marks the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the believers, fulfilling Jesus' promise and empowering them to spread the Gospel. The Holy Spirit, symbolized by tongues of fire and a mighty wind, represents God's active presence in the world and in our lives. This event signifies the birth of the Church and the beginning of its mission to share the Gospel of Christ to all nations.

Discussion Questions

 **Wind & Fire:** Which image grabs you more—the wind or the flame? Why?

 **Filled:** What might a "Spirit-led life" look like on an ordinary Tuesday?

 **Many Tongues:** Where do you see God breaking barriers (cultural, generational, linguistic) in your family, church or community?

 **Next Step:** How do you sense the Holy Spirit leading you to share Christ, and what is one small step you can take this week in response?
