



OVERVIEW

Isaiah has a vision of the Lord seated on His throne in the temple, exalted in glory. Seraphim surround Him, declaring His holiness. Overwhelmed, Isaiah recognizes his sinfulness and unworthiness. A seraph touches his lips with a burning coal, signifying cleansing and forgiveness. Then the Lord asks, “Whom shall I send?” and Isaiah responds, “Here am I. Send me!”

PRAYER

BIBLE: READ ISAIAH 6:1-8

1. What stands out to you most about Isaiah's vision of God in this passage?
2. How do the seraphim describe God (vv. 2–3), and what does that teach us about His character?
3. What is Isaiah's immediate reaction when he sees the Lord (v. 5)?
4. What is the significance of the burning coal touching Isaiah's lips (vv. 6–7)?
5. What question does God ask in verse 8, and how does Isaiah respond?
6. Why do you think Isaiah responds with “Woe to me!” after seeing God's glory?
7. Why do you think Isaiah becomes so aware of his sin in God's presence?
8. What does Isaiah's response, “*Here am I. Send me!*”, show about his heart after witnessing God's holiness and experiencing His forgiveness?

APPLICATION

1. Isaiah confessed, “*I am a man of unclean lips.*” What weaknesses or hindrances in your life might God be calling you to bring into the light so that He can cleanse you? How would allowing God to purify these areas free you to pray with greater confidence and serve Him with greater power?
2. Isaiah responded, “*Here am I. Send me!*” Where do you sense God calling you to step out—perhaps in your workplace, neighborhood, friendships, or church ministry? What holds you back from saying yes, and what steps of obedience might God be asking you to take this week?
