

OVERVIEW

In Daniel 6:10–23, Daniel remains faithful in prayer to God despite a royal decree forbidding it, leading to his being thrown into the lions' den. God miraculously delivers him, revealing His power to protect those who trust and obey Him.

PRAYER

Pray: “Lord, help us to pray with Daniel’s faith and courage, trusting You fully no matter the cost.”

BIBLE: READ DANIEL 6:10-23

1. What does verse 10 tell us about Daniel’s prayer habits? How often did Daniel pray, and in what posture or attitude?
2. Why do you think Daniel chose to continue praying openly even after the decree?
3. What stands out to you about the king’s attitude toward Daniel throughout this passage?
4. What does Daniel’s consistency in prayer reveal about his relationship with God?
5. How does Daniel’s prayer life demonstrate courage and trust in the midst of danger?
6. In what ways does Daniel’s example challenge cultural or governmental pressures?
7. How do you see God’s sovereignty at work in this story?

APPLICATION

1. Daniel’s prayer wasn’t a reaction to crisis—it was a lifelong rhythm. What practical steps can you take to make prayer a regular, intentional part of your daily routine (e.g., setting times, journaling, praying with others)? What obstacles keep you from consistency in prayer, and how might you overcome them?
2. Daniel did not hide his devotion, even when it was dangerous. What are some modern “decrees” or cultural pressures that tempt Christians to keep their faith private? What does courageous faith look like in your workplace, school, or community? How can prayer strengthen that courage?
