



OVERVIEW

In Ephesians 5:1–20, Paul calls believers to imitate God by walking in love, purity, wisdom, and Spirit-filled worship. He contrasts the old life of darkness with the new identity believers have in Christ as “children of light.” Paul emphasizes that the Christian life is not merely avoiding sin, but learning to live wisely, gratefully, and under the direction of the Holy Spirit rather than the values and impulses of the world.

BIBLE: READ EPHESIANS 5:1-20

1. According to verses 1-2, what kind of life are believers called to model themselves after?
2. Why do you think Paul speaks so strongly about sexual immorality, impurity, greed, and corrupt speech?
3. Which sins in verses 3-7 are often normalized or minimized in modern culture?
4. What contrasts do you see between darkness and light in this passage? What does it mean to “live as children of light” (verse 8) in daily life?
5. What do you think Paul means by “making the most of every opportunity” (verse 16)? What are some common distractions that keep believers from living intentionally?
6. According to verses 18–20, what are some signs of a Spirit-filled life? What flows outward from a life led by the Spirit?

APPLICATION

1. Paul says believers are to imitate God in love and purity. What messages about success, pleasure, identity, or relationships are Christians subtly pressured to imitate today? What does it practically look like to imitate Christ instead of the surrounding culture? What intentional practices help you become more like Jesus over time?
2. Paul encourages us to speak to one another with worship and gratitude. What kinds of conversations tend to dominate our daily lives? Anxiety? Complaints? Politics? Productivity? Humor? How can you use your words this week to encourage and spiritually strengthen someone else’s faith and walk with Jesus?
