

Sermon Series: God Makes a Way

The Passover Lamb | Exodus 12:21-31

Ohana Group Discussion Questions: Week of September 6th, 2026

OVERVIEW

In the final plague, God provides a way for Israel to be spared from judgment. Each household is commanded to sacrifice a spotless lamb and place its blood on the doorposts; when the LORD sees the blood, He passes over that household. The Passover ultimately points forward to Jesus Christ, the true Passover Lamb, whose blood delivers us from the judgment of sin (John 1:29; 1 Corinthians 5:7).

PRAYER

Pray: Lord, thank You for providing Jesus, our Passover Lamb; help us to trust in His saving work and respond with faith, gratitude, worship, and obedience.



BIBLE: READ EXODUS 12:21-31

1. What were the Israelites commanded to do with the Passover lamb and its blood? According to verse 23, why was the blood so important?
2. Why did God command Israel to remember the Passover and explain it to their children?
3. Why is it important for us to regularly remember and share what God has done to save us?
4. Verse 27 says that when the Israelites heard God's instructions, they "bowed down and worshiped." What does their response teach us about the connection between salvation and worship?
5. Read verses 29–30. What do these verses reveal about the seriousness and certainty of God's judgment? How does this affect the way we understand our need for salvation?
6. Read John 1:29 and 1 Corinthians 5:7. How does the Passover lamb point us to Jesus? What similarities do you see between the blood of the Passover lamb and Christ's death on the cross?



APPLICATION

1. The Passover reminds us that salvation comes through God's provision, not our own goodness. Where are you tempted to rely on yourself rather than fully trusting in Christ and what He has done for you?
2. The Israelites responded to God's saving promise by bowing down and worshiping (v. 27). How should remembering that Jesus is our Passover Lamb shape your gratitude, worship, and daily life?
